More than a Building

The following reflection was written by Camryn Tracy. After attending Bergamo's Spiritus Retreat (for juniors) and World's Greatest Retreat as a student at Alter High School, Camyrn facilitated Bergamo retreats from 2017-2019.

I am a firm believer that when your foundation is strong as a person, you can weather any challenge, storm, or obstacle. For someone who may not be familiar with Bergamo, it could appear to be just another building. Walls filled with paintings and slight wear, carpet that has been walked on thousands of times over the years, and the scent of a building that is standing the test of time. However, when you look past the initial visuals of the building, there is a special magic that can only be seen if you choose to look for it.

The walls are not just filled with paintings, but are also filled with the laughs, tears, and friendship that have enveloped each crevice of the rooms. They have heard the challenges of some of the strongest kids. The letdowns of these same kids when they first realized their greatest heroes are also just humans. 

I have worked here for 7 years as a front desk receptionist! You will see me here most weekday evenings and sometimes on weekends.


